## Medical Research

The Healthcare Team at Perth & Scone Medical Group strives to ensure that your medical information is kept safe and secure and is only used for the purposes in which was intended to be used. The practice conforms to the current legislation on GDPR (General Data Protection Regulations) 2018.

From time to time, we are asked to provide data which is then used for medical research purposes. To this end, information that we hold about you may be used but this information will only be used in this way for research projects which have been approved by the Local Research Ethics Committee. If you are to be involved in medical research personally, you will be contacted beforehand in order that you can provide your consent for this.

You have the right to object to your identifiable information being used or shared for medical research purposes. Please speak to the practice if you wish to object

### ***Perth & Scone Medical Group shares information from medical records:***

- to support medical research when the law permits us to do so, for example to learn more about why people get ill and what treatments might work best
- for our own research within the practice to shape our own services

### ***This is important because:***

- the use of information from GP medical records is very useful in developing new treatments and medicines
- medical researchers use information from medical records to help answer important questions about illnesses and disease so that improvements can be made to the care and treatment patients receive
- We want to use our resources to serve our own patient population in the most effective manner

***National clinical audits:***

Perth & Scone Medical Group contributes to national clinical audits so that healthcare can be checked and reviewed.

- Information from medical records can help doctors and other healthcare workers measure and check the quality of care which is provided to you
- The results of the checks or audits are used to recommend improvements to patient care
- Data is sent to NHS National Services Scotland, a national body with legal responsibilities to collect data
- The data will include information about you, such as your CHI Number and date of birth and information about your health which is recorded in coded form - for example the code for diabetes or high blood pressure
- We will only share your information for national clinical audits or checking purposes when the law allows
- You have the right to object to your identifiable information being shared for national clinical audits. Please contact the practice if you wish to object

We are required by law to provide you with the following information about how we share your information for medical research purposes.

<b>Purpose</b> of the processing	Medical research and to check the quality of care which is given to patients (this is called national clinical audit).
<b>Lawful basis</b> for processing	<p>The following sections of the GDPR mean that we can use medical records for research and to check the quality of care (national clinical audits)</p> <p>Article 6(1)(e) – ‘processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller’.</p> <p>For medical research: there are two possible Article 9 conditions.</p> <p>Article 9(2)(a) – ‘the data subject has given explicit consent...’</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Article 9(2)(j) – ‘processing is necessary for... scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes in accordance with Article 89(1) based on Union or Member States law which shall be proportionate to the aim pursued, respect the essence of the right to data protection and provide for suitable and specific measures to safeguard the fundamental rights and interests of the data subject’.</p> <p>To check the quality of care (clinical audit):</p> <p>Article 9(2)(h) – ‘processing is necessary for the purpose of preventative...medicine...the provision of health or social care or treatment or the management of health or social care systems and services...’</p>
<b>Recipient or categories of recipients</b> of the processed data	<p>For medical research the data will be shared with approved medical research organisations.</p> <p>For national clinical audits which check the quality of care the data will be shared with NHS National Services Scotland.</p>
<b>Rights to object and the national data opt-out</b>	<p>You have a right to object under the GDPR and the right to ‘opt-out’ under the national data opt-out model. The national data opt-out model provides an easy way for you to opt-out of:</p> <p>information that identifies you being used or shared for medical research purposes and quality checking or audit purposes.</p> <p>Please contact the practice if you wish to opt-out.</p>

<p><b>Right to access and correct</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You have the right to access your medical record and have any errors or mistakes corrected. Please speak to a member of staff or look at our 'subject access request' policy on the practice website – <a href="http://www.perthandscone.co.uk">www.perthandscone.co.uk</a></li> <li>• We are not aware of any circumstances in which you will have the right to delete correct information from your medical record; although you are free to obtain your own legal advice if you believe there is no lawful purpose for which we hold the information and contact us if you hold a different view.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Retention period</b></p>	<p>GP medical records will be kept in line with the law and national guidance.</p>
